
The Hipster Foundation NorCal Arthroplasty Fellowship



Overview

The Hipster Foundation proudly funds the NorCal Arthroplasty Fellowship, led by esteemed surgeons Nicholas Mast, MD and John Diana, MD. Through this fellowship we are training next-generation surgeons in high-value, evidence-based arthroplasty procedures.

The fellowship offers a salary, a Bayarea housing stipend, and direct educational expenses. The fellow will participate in a minimum of 250 primary cases and will be encouraged to be involved in all revision cases with a goal of 25 per annum and exposure to well over 1500 cases.

Fellows will advance their skills in ambulatory surgical centers, outpatient hospital environments, and inpatient care environments. Fellows will contribute to a surgical registry of over 6,000 cases. The fellowship is affiliated with the American Academy of Hip and Knee Surgeons and offers research and publication opportunities.

Your Training Experience

The NorCal Arthroplasty Fellowship focuses on contemporary techniques including conventional, robotic-assisted procedures and computer-assisted navigation. The Hipster Fellowship covers preoperative planning, postoperative care, multimodal pain management, and comprehensive training on:

- Hip and knee arthroplasty, including resurfacing and fracture management
- Knee ligament reconstruction and uni-compartmental arthroplasty
- Surgical Volume approaches 2,000 procedures for the fellowship
- Emphasis on surgical efficiency including 2 OR room setup and management.
- Broad experience in robotic training including Velys, and Mako platforms.
- Among three FDA-approved MAKO TKA centers with unmatched robotic experience
